

COSF Review Worksheet (Emily)
TRAINER NOTES

1. Is the COSF complete? If not, what information is missing?

- The SLP's name is missing
- How the family information was collected is not indicated

2. Does the evidence correspond with the appropriate outcome area? If not, what are some examples where the evidence is listed with the incorrect outcome area?

Outcome 1, there are 3 pieces of information that would fit better with other outcome areas:

- She often will just sit quietly until an adult approaches her and prompts her to ask for help (goes better with outcome 3)
- She counts along with mom, but does not yet do this independently (goes better with outcome 2)
- Follows directions of 3 or more steps not routinely given (goes better with outcome 2)

Outcome 2, there are 2 pieces of information that would fit better with other outcome areas:

- Responds to affective initiations from peers (goes better with outcome 1)
- She has no difficulty with her clothing (pulling pants down/up, etc.) while toileting. (goes better with outcome 3)

Outcome 3, there are 2 pieces of information that would fit better with other outcome areas:

- She is quiet and does not initiate activities or interactions with others (goes better with outcome 1)
- Recalls events that occurred on same day without contextual cues (goes better with outcome 2)

3. Does the evidence provided support the rating? Where is more evidence needed? Where does the evidence clearly suggest the rating is incorrect?

Outcome 1: The summary of relevant results clearly includes some skills and behaviors that are not age appropriate (most obvious is that she does not initiate interactions with adults or other children). Therefore, a 6 rating (which is defined as almost all the skills and behaviors are age appropriate) is clearly too high.

Outcome 2: The summary of relevant results includes few, if any, age appropriate skills and behaviors. Therefore, a 5 rating (which is defined as a mix of age appropriate and not age appropriate skills) is clearly too high.

Outcome 3: The summary of relevant results clearly includes some age appropriate skills and behaviors for a 40 month old (e.g. eating, dressing, physical/motor skills to get needs met). Therefore a 3 rating (which is defined as mostly immediate foundational skills and no age appropriate skills) is clearly too low.
