This is in response to your letter of June 16, 1998, in which you request the Vermont Interagency Coordinating Council (VICC) be granted a waiver by the Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) to allow a representative from one of the co-lead agencies to serve as a co-chair of the VICC. In your letter, you stated that, "Leadership of the VICC is shared through the election of two co-chairs; a parent representative and a professional representative." You also stated that the VICC feels that it is important to retain the parent-professional partnership in the co-chairs of the VICC

Part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (Part C) requires that the Governor of each State appoint a State Interagency Coordinating Council (ICC) that is reasonably representative of the population of the State. IDEA Sec. 641(a); 34 CFR §303.600(b) It also requires that the Governor designate a member of the Council to serve as the chairperson of the Council, or requires the Council to designate such a member. The chairperson of the ICC may not be a representative of the lead agency. Sec. 641(a)(3); 34 CFR §303.600(c). The Secretary does not have authority to grant a waiver of the requirement that the ICC chair not be a representative of the lead agency
