Each early intervention program should demonstrate compliance with Part C and Baby Watch Early Intervention Program requirements in the following areas:

4. Provides comprehensive year-round early intervention services in natural environments with flexible hours/days to meet the needs of families		
5. Provides multidisciplinary evaluation of the needs of children, and family-directed identification of the needs of the family, using at least 1 standardized evaluation tool		
<ol> <li>Makes early intervention services available to all infants and toddlers with disabilities and their families, including traditionally underserved minority, homeless, and foster care populations</li> </ol>		
7. Engages in ongoing and comprehensive child-find and referral activities within the service area		
8. Provides every family with a written description of the program, policies, and parent rights.		
9. Makes an effort to communicate with parents and families in their preferred language		
10. Has a policy and procedure manual that has been developed for, communicated to, and is made available to employees		
11. Supports employees in completing Comprehensive System of Personnel Development (CSPD) training requirements		
12. Participates in ICC, grantee meetings, and has representation or affiliation with other professional organizations serving children and families
