





Act Early Ambassadors

- ~50% worked to embed or integrate resources in Child Find systems
- ~37% report that programs in their state are regularly using LTSAE for child find activities
- Activities
 - Collaborating to improve or create policy or protocol
 - □ Customizing LTSAE materials
 - Collaborating on training
 - Serving on ICCs and other councils

Ambassadors and Parent Centers

How Ambassadors and Parent Centers are working together to support parents and improve early identification

- Information sharing and making referrals to each other
- Serving on committees together
- Collaborating on grants and training activities
- Being involved together in Act Early State Teams
- Sharing and disseminating each other's information
- Co-developing resources
- Having formal relationships--contracts or other relationships with each other's organizations


