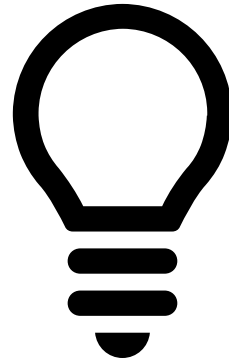

Key Definitions

Traditional CoPs are groups of people who share a concern, a set of problems, or a passion about a topic, and who deepen their knowledge and expertise in this area by interacting on an ongoing basis.

Virtual CoPs are “online social networks in which people with common interests, goals, or practices interact to share information and knowledge, and engage in social interactions.” They are like traditional CoPs in that both are made up of members who mutually engage in a shared practice to facilitate learning.

(Wenger, McDermott & Snyder, 2002)

Purposes of Traditional and Virtual CoPs

- Connect people
- Provide a shared context
- Enable dialogue
- Stimulate learning
- Introduce collaborative processes
- Help people organize
- Capture and diffuse existing knowledge
- Generate new knowledge

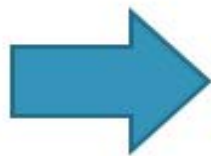
Benefits of Traditional and Virtual CoPs

- Decreased feelings of isolation
- Reduced staff turnover
- Strengthened consistency with guiding frameworks, documents, and policy information
- Increased awareness of resources
- Improved services to children and families

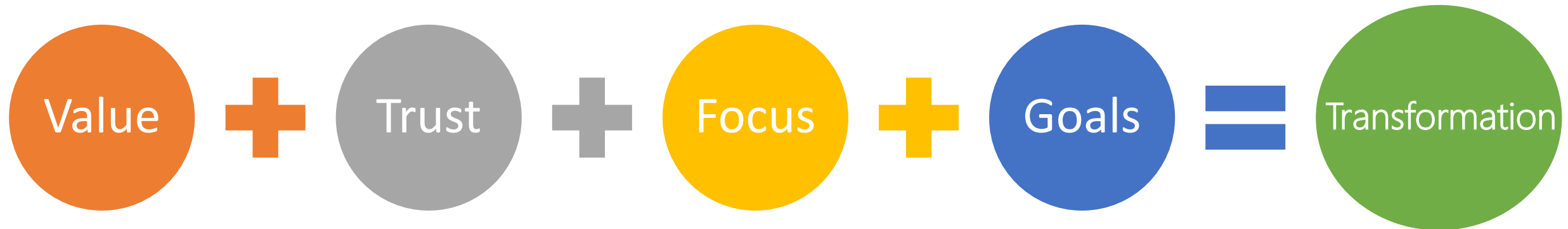

Successful management of online Communities of Practice can be greatly informed by strategic and ongoing evaluation practices.

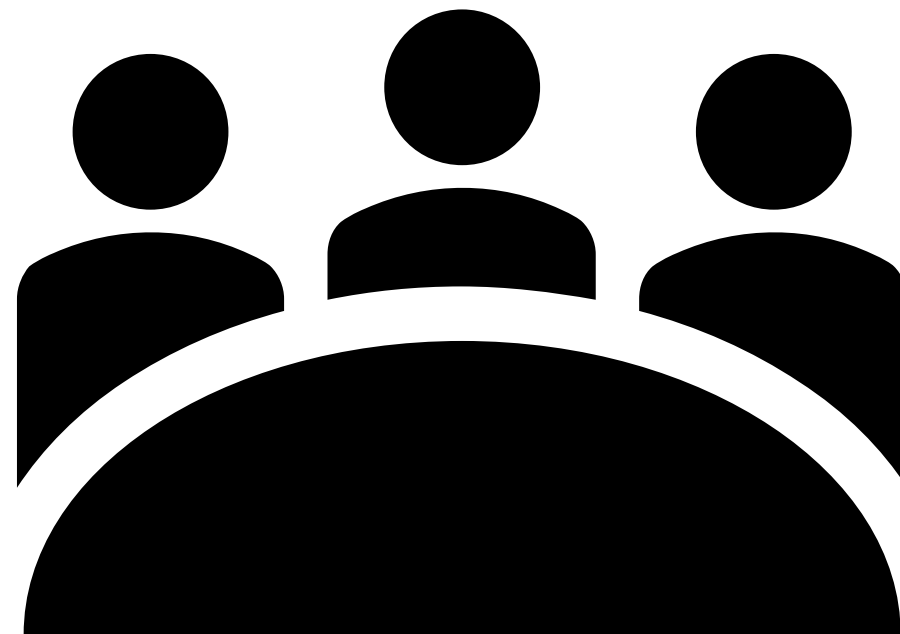

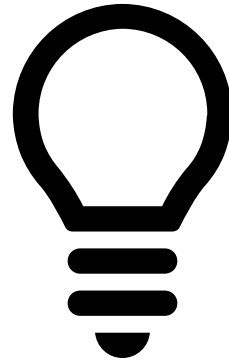
