Is the COS Rating Subjective?

- What is subjectivity?
 - Related to the mind of the rater <u>rather than</u> the nature of the subject being rated.
- COS ratings involve clinical decision-making based on a confluence of data (i.e., data from multiple sources).

Informed Decisions

- Research on clinical judgment shows that professionals can reach reliable conclusions under certain conditions.
- Conditions:
 - 1. Operational definitions of the observed attributes (e.g., the 3 outcomes);
 - 2. Structured rating format to record informed opinion;
 - 3. Data gathered from multiple sources;
 - 4. Consensus-decision making process; and
 - 5. Training to facilitate reliable ratings.

COS Rating Decisions

"Team decision-making is a viable method for reaching valid conclusions about the abilities/performance of children with disabilities."
