- 3. You may have mentioned any three of the following:
 - a. Going on a field trip at the beginning of a classroom unit or covering a theme.
 - b. Using video on the topic or theme
 - c. Providing materials in the native language to encourage parent support in teaching the content,
 - d. Using props during store time.
- 4. You may have mentioned planning ahead for what questions to ask children, when to ask these questions and how to use / capture these data (e.g., notes, photos, etc.).
